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Here's a rundown of some of the business comings and goings as the season winds down.

## **Esplanade**

Closings: Greyson Clothiers, House of Lavande (jewelry).

Other changes: Milou Palm Beach, fashion and accessories, will move into the House of Lavande space. Another, as yet unnamed store will be leaving before fall, said Francis X. Scire Jr., senior vice president and head of leasing and marketing for O'Connor Capital Partners. Chanel Palm Beach will move temporarily into the spot vacated by the relocated Milou. Chanel is renovating its shop at 301 Worth Ave.

## **Royal Poinciana Plaza**

Closings: Destination Soul (indoor cycling); Lululemon (athletic apparel for men and women); The Yoga Society Palm Beach (Lululemon and The Yoga Society occupied the same space).

Destination Soul and Lululemon were both short-term deals and the leases expired in April, said General Manager Lilly Ferreira. "Leasing conversations are ongoing."

Openings during the season (and businesses that will remain): 100% Capri (November); Alice + Olivia (December) Gavlak Gallery (December); Roller Rabbit (December); The Grand Tour by Caroline Rafferty (February); Zadig & Voltaire (December); Stoner Clover Lane (November); and La Clara Palm Beach (February).

## **South County Road**

Openings/ relocations: Evelyn & Arthur moved from North County Road and Royal Poinciana Way to 239 S. County Road; All Brand Vacuums moved from 350 to 305 S. County Road; Pierce-Archer (picture framing) moved from Peruvian Avenue to 235 S. County Road; Peterbrooke Chocolatier Palm Beach moved from Royal Poinciana Way to 298 S. County Road.

B. Peterson, 240 S. County Road, doubled its size this season, said Patti Sans, president of the Greater South County Road Association.

## **Worth Avenue**

Closings: "I haven't seen any closings yet," said Marley Herring, vice president of the Worth Avenue Association. "I think people wait until the season is over. If they're going to move to another spot on the avenue, they usually do it in summer."
